



## The Halsey Institute of Contemporary Art Announces La Vaughn Belle: When the Land Meets the Body

## Open August 25-December 9, 2023

**Charleston, S.C.**- The Halsey Institute of Contemporary Art at the College of Charleston School of the Arts has announced *When the Land Meets the Body* by renowned artist La Vaughn Belle, on display until December 9.

In this exhibition, multidisciplinary artist La Vaughn Belle seeks to explore the relationship of history, land, and the bodies between them, and considers that who we are is a product of historical processes that are often represented in the landscape. When the Land Meets the Body is Belle's first solo museum exhibition, and will present a selection of existing and new works. This work includes Belle's Storm (How to Imagine the Tropicalia as Monumental), which features large-scale paintings that piece together cut, torn, and burned paper to create cartographies of shifting landscapes and seascapes to explore the turbulent histories that have shaped the Caribbean. An expanded presentation of the series For Those of Us Who Live At The Shoreline considers liminal social and environmental spaces. Belle's Swarm series creates a physical intervention of cuts and burns in reproductions of colonial imagery that seek to emphasize the Black bodies captured in the photographs, and transform the violence endemic in them. The exhibition also includes previously unseen watercolors from the Every Island is an Effort at Memory series, displayed within a mural installation. Lastly, the Halsey Institute commissioned Belle to create a new video work centered on the Lowcountry landscape; Effluvia offers a lyrical essay on the marshlands surrounding Charleston, SC that were the site of rice cultivation by enslaved Africans and African Americans.

Borrowing from elements of architecture, history, and archeology, Belle, who is currently based in the U.S. Virgin Islands, creates narratives that challenge colonial hierarchies and invisibility through her artistic practices including painting, photography, video and more. She has exhibited her work in many notable institutions across the globe including the National Photography Museum and the Vestsjælland Museum in Denmark. She is the co-creator of <u>I Am</u> <u>Queen Mary</u>, the groundbreaking monument located in Copenhagen, which was featured in over 100 media outlets including *The New York Times, Politiken, VICE, BBC Radio* and *Le Monde*.
